



DEPLOYMENT OF RESPONSE PERSONNEL

- Under no circumstances should any member deploy without being instructed by control, this is important for your wellbeing and to ensure that you are insured 'on duty'. If we don't know that you have been called out we cannot be responsible for ensuring that you get home safely.
- At the scene members should use CB channel 32 (UK) or any other channel which may be notified on the day.
- CB is primarily for short range use i.e. vehicle to vehicle in pairs or convoy. Although mobile phones can often be used, and the numbers should be known by the control, under certain circumstances they may not be available, for instance security considerations or extreme weather.
- By whichever method is appropriate you should notify the control of any major event; which may be a request for transport of goods or people for any purpose on behalf of the calling party, a requirement for additional units or possibly a transfer to another user i.e. from assisting Police to assisting the Ambulance service.
- If it becomes apparent that the incident is likely to last longer than anticipated then you should consider whether you wish to be relieved to return to work or family or whether anyone needs to be notified on your behalf.

AFTER THE INCIDENT IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOU ENSURE THAT THE CONTROL IS AWARE THAT:

- You have been stood-down and are returning to home or work,
- You are safely at your destination.
